Dear Colleagues,



It's wonderful to see the **Team around the School** programme starting to reap benefits in schools. I know of at least one of the school age plus workers attending a parent's evening this past week and many came to speak to her about who she was and what she could offer. The same worker offers a monthly drop-in service to parents and is now getting involved in supporting year 6 transitioning to their high schools which is a really useful piece of early intervention work. The school has seen an increase in school attendance this school year and has stated that one of the reasons is the Team around the School and the support and responses from their school age plus worker and social worker.


There is another Way by Ian Gilbert @ITL Worldwide- The Second Big Book of Independent Thinking
